Parties to an Export Shipment

Domestic Parties:

- U.S. Principal Party in Interest
- U.S. Authorized Agent
- Carrier

Foreign Parties:

- Foreign Principal Party in Interest
- Ultimate Consignee



U.S. Principal Party in Interest [FTR 30.3]

The U.S. Principal Party in Interest is the:

- U.S. Person or Entity
- Primary Beneficiary of Export Shipment

Generally that person can be the:

- U.S. Seller
- U.S. Manufacturer
- U.S. Order Party
- U.S. Customs Broker
- Foreign Entity



U.S. Authorized Agent [FTR 30.1]

Who is the U.S. Authorized Agent?

A party physically located in the U.S. that obtains a *power of attorney (POA)* or *written authorization* from a USPPI or FPPI to prepare and file the electronic export information (EEI).



Foreign Principal Party in Interest (FPPI) [FTR 30.1]

A party abroad who purchases the goods for export or to whom final delivery or end-use of the goods will be made.

Example:

The ultimate consignee may be the FPPI, however this is not always the case.



Ultimate Consignee [FTR 30.1]

Who is the Ultimate Consignee?

The person, party, or designee that is located abroad and actually receives the export shipment. This party may be the end user or the FPPI.





What is a Shipment? [FTR 30.1]

Tip: The ONE Rule

- ONE U.S. Principal Party in Interest shipping their merchandise, to
- **ONE** Foreign consignee, on
- ONE Carrier moving the product out of the U.S., on
- ONE day, and over \$2,500 per Schedule B number or requires a license



Filing Requirements





When is EEI required? [FTR 30.2(a)(1)(iv)]

- Shipment licensed by government agencies
- ITAR controlled items
- Sanctioned by the Office of Foreign Asset Control
- Rough diamonds
- Used self-propelled vehicles
- Items identified in "600 Series", in paragraphs .a through .x



When is EEI Not Required? Exemptions [FTR 30.2(a)(1)(iv)]

- Country of ultimate destination is Canada [30.36(a)]
- \$2,500 or less per Schedule B number [30.37(a)]
- Tools of Trade: hand-carried, personal or company use, not for sale, not shipped as cargo, returned within 1 year [30.37(b)]
- Temporary exports that are exported from and returned to the US in less than one year
- Goods previously imported under a TIB for return in the same condition as when imported



Export Transactions





Standard Export Transaction [FTR 30.3]

The USPPI files the Electronic Export Information(EEI) or authorizes a U.S. agent to file on

its behalf.





Standard Export: USPPI [FTR 30.3(c)(1)]

Responsibilities:

- Licensing determination
- Provide the U.S. agent with POA or written authorization
- Provide the U.S. agent with timely export information



Standard Export: Authorized Agent [FTR 30.3(c)(2)]

Responsibilities:

- Obtain POA or written authorization from USPPI
- Upon request, provide the USPPI with a copy of the export information



Routed Export Transaction [FTR 30.3(e)]

FPPI authorizes a U.S. agent to facilitate the export shipment from the U.S. and to prepare and file the EEI

Example:

A customer in Japan places an order for pencils and asks the U.S. manufacturer to send them to his U.S. agent in N.J. for export.



Routed Export: Authorized Agent [FTR 30.3(e)(2)]

Responsibilities:

- Obtain POA or written authorization from the FPPI
- Prepare and file EEI
- Provide filing citation or exemption legend
- Upon request, provide the USPPI with data elements
- Upon request, provide the USPPI with a copy of the POA or written authorization received from the FPPI



Routed Export: USPPI [FTR 30.3(e)(1)]

Responsibilities:

- Provide data & licensing information
- If filing, obtain POA from FPPI to complete and file the EEI
- May request copy of the POA or written authorization from the authorized agent
- May request a copy of the data elements

Penalties [FTR 30.71]

Criminal Penalties

- U.S. exporters, agents, or carriers who knowingly fail to file, file false or misleading information, or continue to participate in illegal activities
- Penalty can be up to \$10,000 per violation and/or imprisonment for no more than five years

Civil Penalties

- U.S. exporters, agents, or carriers who report incorrect information or report export information late
- Penalty can be up to \$10,000 per violation or \$1,100 per each day of delinquency



Voluntary Self Disclosure (VSD) [FTR 30.74]

Submit a letter detailing:

- Type of violation
- When & how the violations occurred
- All parties (foreign & domestic) related to the violations
- Any mitigating circumstances
- Number & value of shipments affected
- Corrective measures
- Corrected or filed shipments



What is Schedule B?

- U.S. export commodities are organized in Schedule B
- Schedule B Search Engine can be used to find export commodities
- There are more than 9,000 export commodity codes

What is the Global Market Finder?

- Global Market Finder is an interactive data tool for U.S. exporters that is free and open to the public
- It provides annual & most recent quarter's U.S. export data at the commodity level
 - ✓ Value USD
 - ✓ Quantity
 - ✓ Unit price
 - ✓ Country of destination
 - ✓ Method of transportation
- Manufacturers and other businesses wishing to expand their business globally can use it to identify potential markets and compare existing markets






View Data on a Map



Additional Data Source USA Trade Online


- USA Trade Online is an online database that is free and open to the public
- It provides monthly and annual U.S. export and import data at the commodity level
 - ✓ Commodity (HS and NAICS codes)
 - ✓ Measure (\$ value, quantity, unit value, air/ vessel \$ value and shipping weight)
 - ✓ Country, geographic region, trade agreement, international organization
 - ✓ State
 - ✓ District
 - ✓ Port
 - ✓ Time
